2. Supporting Students

- a. After the passing of our student on October 31st, the district has been tremendous with supporting our school community. Immediately after the passing, we set up the Library as a Grief Room where students were able to share their thoughts with the family by writing messages on large pieces of paper and share stories about the student in a large circle.
- b. To support students, the district provided District Counsellors for more than a week and extra teachers to support staff. Schools sent food on a daily basis for staff. We met on a daily basis to monitor our community and whether students required continued support.
- c. Currently, we are running group counselling every Wednesday morning through Delta Hospice and 1-on-1 Counselling through the Delta Boys and Girls Club.
- d. The school sent flowers to the family and I visited the family home twice. PAC sent a Gift Basket.



- e. Continuing to monitor the progress of our vulnerable students who were directly impacted by the loss.
- 3. Dr. Stan Kucher's Mental Wellness Curriculum
 - a. On Friday, November 23rd the Seaquam staff attended a presentation by North Vancouver School district staff regarding how their district has implemented the Mental Wellness curriculum in their district.
 - b. North Vancouver has implemented the curriculum at the grade 9 level where schools have used varying models to deliver the curriculum.
 - c. Seaquam staff will be sending 3 teachers to obtain training with the curriculum with the understanding of developing a team to implement the curriculum next school year as a pilot for the Delta School District.

DPAC Report - Lakhvir Brar, DPAC Vice Chair

- Inclusive Learning:
 - Presentation on the District's plan for Inclusive Learning, presented by Director of Inclusive Learning Joanna Angelidis
 - Previously referred to as Special Education
 - Includes all students identified with a diagnosis of some kind and/or those experiencing a challenge in education journey (i.e. emotional trauma)
 - Philosophy: All children have the right to obtain an appropriate public education irrespective of the degree of their disability. Education should take place in the least restrictive environment.
 - Delta District's vision for Inclusion:
- Every child has voice, choice, and connection
- High expectations exist for all students
- Learning is designed from the start with all students in mind and included
 - Focus on meaningful and purposeful inclusion (and not just physically integrated in the classroom) and with roles and responsibilities in the classroom and integrated with their peers so children feel like they belong in the community.
- Teams working together to co-create inclusive learning environments and opportunities:
- District-based team (District Administrators, Coordinators, Specialized Professionals)
- School-based team (School-based Case Managers, Classroom Teachers)
- Support Staff (Education Assistants, Child and Youth Care Workers)
- sErase 2.0:
 - Ministry of Education's anti-bullying initiative
 - Program revisions are in progress to deliver a more effective program to help build safer and more caring school communities.
 - Updates to the program to be announced shortly, including anonymous reporting of bullying directly to the Ministry and formal complaint process
 - Ministry also working with provincial health authorities to revamp program to deliver access to more community-based supports.
 - For Delta, this also includes access to a dedicated nurse from Fraser Health assigned to work with our District.
