Principal's Report - Mr. Mesich

School Goal: Will a school wide focus on fostering student health and wellness have a positive effect on student well-being, engagement and achievement?

2. Christmas Hampers:

On behalf of the Seaquam staff, 6 hampers were organized by the office staff to give to our most vulnerable families. Ms. Virk and Ms. Amorelli delivered the hampers. All families were surprised and appreciative of the gesture from the school.

3. My Education Attendance Notification

The district team has been having issues with our old system to transition to the My Education system. The team is working through the issues and we are slowly figuring out how to best report attendance on a daily basis. We are hoping this issue gets rectified as soon as possible.

4. Flex Time investigation:

The Flex Time committee will be meeting more frequently as we move closer to the end of the school year to survey our community and to develop a recommendation to staff that will include:

- a. whether or not we continue with Flex Time
- b. if we continue with Flex Time, what Flex Time model will we adopt.



5. Career Education 8 and 9 Conference

On Wednesday, January 22nd, the grade 8 and 9 students experienced a Career Day where they had the opportunity to start investigating possible careers. The day started with a Keynote speaker named Nathan Wilson, Indigenous Education Facilitator, who shared his family's experiences in various careers and traditional Indigenous stories. The day transitioned to small group workshop on a variety of topics. Students will be surveyed on their experience and provided opportunities to reflect.

6. Grade 10 Exam Week April 14-17

The Ministry of Education has notified school districts that any ministry assessment will take place over the course of the school year and be used as a formative assessment to help schools provide staff with data to help students in areas of Numeracy and Literacy. Grade 10 students will be writing the Numeracy and Literacy assessments between April 14th and 17th where grade 10 students will only attend school to write the exams. Each student will be at school for 2 half day sessions during this week.

7. Grade 9 Mental Health Curriculum April 14-17

Seaquam staff will be introducing the Mental Health Curriculum to the grade 9 students during this week. The schedule for the day will be:
