Principal's Report - Given by Vice-Principal Mr. Nikic

We would also like to offer our respect to all the Elders who have gone before us, the indigenous people who are with us today and to all Canadians who are on the journey of Reconciliation. We offer gratitude to the Musqueam people who honour our school with the name, Seaguam, which in their language means sunshine.

- Pro D day on Jan 27 staff was looking the new reporting order for next year. Performance Standings will be the norm for all Grade 8 and 9 courses.
- Basketball up and running. Senior boys and girls, Junior boys and girls, Grade 9 boys and Grade 8 boys and girls. Senior girls are ranking in the top 10 in the province. Seasons will be over mid to late February
- Literary assessment for the grade 10s is done. Next assessment is Grade 10 numeracy in April and make for Grade 12's
- Regular Immunization for grade 9's coming up soon. Forms going out on Feb 1.
- Lip Sync on last day of classes before the Winter Break. We had Gr 10-12 in the theatre and live streamed to the gym for Gr 8-9. Not prefect but a lot of fun.
- Course planning is beginning on Feb 28. Prior to this counsellors will visit all students and students making selections.
- Parent nights Grade 7 on Jan 24, Grade 8-11 on Feb 13. We had over 350 people in the audience for the Grade 7 one.
- Secondary Futures is a group that has been meeting since last year to look at what type of system we will use next year at Seaquam. I have spoke to Teachers and Dyac already this January. Decision will be made by Principal on Feb 28. Focus group on Feb 16 3:30 – 5:30 using the Decision making Playbook.
- New Student registration, Cross Catchment and Out of District applications will be accepted starting Feb 6 all on-line this year.
- A variety of surveys coming up. UBC's Middle Years Development Instrument (Gr 8), Satisfaction Survey (Gr 8-12), PCAP (gr 10), Compas (Gr 8) Tell them from Me (Gr 8-12)
- Boys Soccer Provincials Seaquam finished 14th
- Girls Volleyball Provincials Seaguam finished 7th
- Robotics Competition in West Van very good showing by all of the teams. We are ranked top 10 in the world. World Championships in May.
- Cafeteria continues to provide awesome food. We now have tap.
- Dec 7 the Grads looked at their TVR's to check to see if they are graduating and that all of their courses are on it.



- Dec we hosted 2 afterschool session of Artist Alley where students could sell their art/craft wares
- Dec Winter Scholarship Music concert put on by students.
- Grade games Volleyball (Grads) and Kahoot school trivia (Staff). All admission fees will go towards a scholarship
- Karaoke night was well attended and students enjoyed it
- The Morning Show students adlib a morning show in the foyer every Thursday before school starts
- Dec Choir singing carols in the entry way before the Winter Break
- Dec Grad Breakfast with Santa
- Seaquam students organized a second Music in the Neighbourhood concert. They raised money for Balding for Dollars BC Children's Hospital
- Ski and Snowboard club had their first trip to Whistler on Jan 27
- Student Clothing went on sale this month
- We continue to help Families and students in financial need from the Provincial money we have gotten.
