Principal's Report - Given by Vice-Principal Mr. Nikic

We offer gratitude to the Musqueam people who honour our school with the name, Seaguam, which in their language means sunshine.

- Staff and Student sickness
 - We have noticed a large increase in the number of staff and students that are away sick
 flu, cold and COVID
 - o One day, last week, we were at about 32% of students away
 - o It is fluctuating between 15-25% for students
 - o District is monitoring all the numbers and reporting to Fraser Health if necessary
- Newsletter
 - Trying to keep staff, students and families up to date.
 - Emailed and posted on website
- Sports
 - Football had a great season. Both teams made playoffs with the Senior team going further than the Juniors. The Seniors lost this weekend so their season is over.
 - Volleyball
 - Senior Girls going to provincials in Kelowna Dec 1-3. They won the South Fraser Championships
 - Senior Boys finished 5th in South Fraser Championships and had a great season.
 They were ranked in the top 10 all season
 - Junior and Grade 8 boys and girls has good seasons. They made Delta District championships.
 - Swimming we had provincials Friday and Saturday. 1 of our students won 2 events and came in 2nd in the other.
 - Soccer Senior boys are going to provincials this week. They play on Nov 24-26 in Burnaby
 - Basketball tryouts have started. No teams have been selected because volleyball and soccer have gone on so long.
- Grad
 - o Grad clothing is getting organized and an order link will come out soon.
 - The return of the Grad Games starts tomorrow. The first even is floor hockey against the Staff.



- Grade games consist of: volleyball, indoor soccer, floor hockey, softball, basketball and Jeopardy style knowledge game (1 school related questions and 1 non school related)

- Literacy 12 Assessment
 - This grad requirement was completed. Most students wrote it but there will be some that we need to catch up on it.
- Halloween dress up
 - o This went over very well. Lots of staff and students participated
- Take Our Kids to Work Day Nov 2
 - This was a day for our Grade 9 students to go to work with a parent, family member or friend. This is a great opportunity for students to see what work looks like. Most of our students participated
- Remembrance Day assembly
 - o We had two assemblies because we can not fit everyone in the theatre at the same time
 - o The concert band and choir performed and it was a very nice assembly
- Solution Society
 - o They did a canned food drive that was a success. The food is going to Surry Food Bank
- Digital Citizens assembly
 - This was for Grade 8 and 9 students. The presenter was from Safer Schools and he spoke about consent, safety, respect and what to do if things are doing wrong.
