GRADUATION CREDITS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Each course taken **and PASSED** will be assigned 2 numerical values:
 - % - Final Grade
 - Credits earned (2 or 4)
- **Credits** are accumulated in order to meet the MINIMUM required (80) for graduation
- **Requirements** are those courses that ALL BC STUDENTS must take in order to graduate
- Some Universities and College programs may have extra requirements – check!!!
- Please note: for IB requirements/Credits please see an **Ms. Matthews!**

PSI: ADMISSION AND PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- **Admission requirements** are courses required by post secondary institutions.
 - Each institution has their own set of admission requirements
- **Program requirements** are specific to each program within a post secondary institution
 - Each program has their own set of requirements
 - These will vary between institutions and between provinces

Remember: Always have at least 2 options to pursue!

- You must successfully complete 1 of the following courses, to meet **graduation requirements**:
 - English First Peoples 12 (also English credit)
 - English First Peoples 11 (also English credit)
 - BC First Peoples 12 (also Socials credit)
 - Contemporary Indigenous Studies
 - English First Peoples New Media & Literacy Studies 10 (also English 10 credit)

- The following courses need to be completed in grade 12 to meet graduation requirement:
 - English 12 or English First Peoples 12
 - Career Life Connections 12
 - 3 other Grade 12 level courses
 - (all other courses are deemed “electives”)
- ***Reminder that you NEED to select 8 courses!***

REQUIRED ASSESSMENTS

GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Provincial Assessments required for graduation
 - Literacy 10
 - Numeracy 10
 - Literacy 12

COURSE SELECTION CONSIDERATIONS

- Choose courses wisely – be informed
 - Know grad requirements
 - Know admission requirements
 - Know program requirements
- Changes to course requests after selection closes will put you at disadvantage to get required courses
 - Limited space / courses / movement in schedule

COURSE SELECTION

CLE-10 & CLC-12

- BOTH courses need to be successfully completed for graduation!!
- CLC-12 is completed online through Delta Access
- 30 hours of volunteer or work hours are a required component of the CLC course.
 - Keep your pay stubs or reference letters as evidence!

COURSE SELECTION

MATHEMATICS CONSIDERATIONS

- Any Math II course will meet graduation requirements in BC
 - Pre-Calc / Foundations / Apprenticeship & Workplace
- Post Secondary Science / Business Programs:
 - Pre-Calc II / 12 (& possibly Calculus 12) required
- Arts Programs:
 - Pre-Calc II or Foundations II
 - UBC (Van) + Foundations 12
- Workplace II may not meet academic program requirements for some schools but not all!
 - Check your schools and programs of interest!

COURSE SELECTION LANGUAGE CONSIDERATIONS

- Languages 11 / 12 courses are **no longer** an admission or program requirement for most post secondary schools in Canada
 - Check carefully!
- Any Language 12 can still be used for University entrance consideration, as an academic course

COURSE SELECTION STUDY BLOCK

- All students who are on track for graduation with sufficient credits and requirements likely met, **may select a study block during course selection**
 - Purpose: to complete online CLC Capstone Program course requirements

COURSE SELECTION

PEER TUTORING 12

- Students with **exemplary** work habits, attendance and interpersonal skills may apply to become a peer tutor for younger classes.
- Students **apply** to the program by filling in the online application BUT strict requirements must be upheld:
 - Applications and list of expectations posted online
 - Must be completed and returned to counsellor by **April 1st** for consideration.
- Final placement of the peer tutor is at the discretion of the Peer Tutor Coordinator.

- Youth Explore Trades Skills I I/I2
 - Framing, electrical and plumbing

COURSE SELECTION COURSE REQUEST

- All students to log into MyED between **February 13th and March 2nd** to select courses
 - Return as many time as needed - **get it right!!**
 - Timetable is built based upon your requests!
- Priority given to students who complete on time
- Complete online form on Laptop or PC
 - Screens may be limited on mobile device or Chromebooks
- Complete **alternate list** of course requests
- Request to reset MyED password via online link on website and QR code at School Office.

COURSE SELECTION

DISTRICT CAREER PROGRAMS

- Students can begin their apprentice training while still enrolled at Seaquam while
 - Earning grants towards furthering their education
 - Earning credits towards their high school graduation

ONLINE COURSES

ONLINE COURSE CONSIDERATIONS

- Academic and non-Academic courses available
 - Fully accredited courses towards graduation
 - Courses appear on transcripts just like classroom courses do
- Rigor of academic topics is similar to direct instruction classes
 - Students required to be self motivated
 - Depth and breadth is not as significant as direct instruction classes!
- Online courses can be used for admissions but must be completed ahead of June 30
- Recommend students take courses through [Delta Access](#) to ensure communication with Seaquam counsellors

ONLINE COURSE CONSIDERATIONS

- Students are expected to communicate with counselors that they are planning to take online courses
 - Course Selection vs Online courses
 - Course Selection vs Summer School
- Students will **not** be automatically dropped from classroom course should they want to take an online course
 - Proof of registration may be requested
 - Proof of graduation requirements being met
 - Proof of parental support / responsibility taken
 - Maintain FULL-TIME enrollment at Seaquam (8+ courses including CLC12)

PROGRAMS

- Usually require courses such as:
 - High school graduation
 - Typically 70%+ in English 12
 - Often require **ACADEMIC** Math courses!
 - Please see Program specific courses

GENERAL
PROGRAM
CONSIDERATION
ARTS PROGRAMS

- Usually require courses such as:
 - Foundations Math 11 or 12 or Pre-Calc 11
 - Generally 80% or higher for university entrance

GENERAL PROGRAM CONSIDERATION

BUSINESS & COMPUTING SCIENCES

- Usually require courses such as:
 - Pre-Calc 11 / 12 & possibly Calculus 12
 - 5 Academic courses (research your choices!)
 - Program specific course requirements!
- Require 85%+ average (or higher) for direct entrance
 - May require higher for early entrance consideration!

GENERAL PROGRAM CONSIDERATION SCIENCE & HEALTH PROGRAMS

Usually require courses such as:

- Pre-Calc 11 / 12 & possibly Calculus 12
- Chemistry 11
- Physics 11
- Additional Program specific grade 12 sciences

- Generally 90%+ for direct Program entrance
 - But remember...
 - Nursing requires Chem 11 and **Bio 11!!**

**** Always have a backup Plan B!**



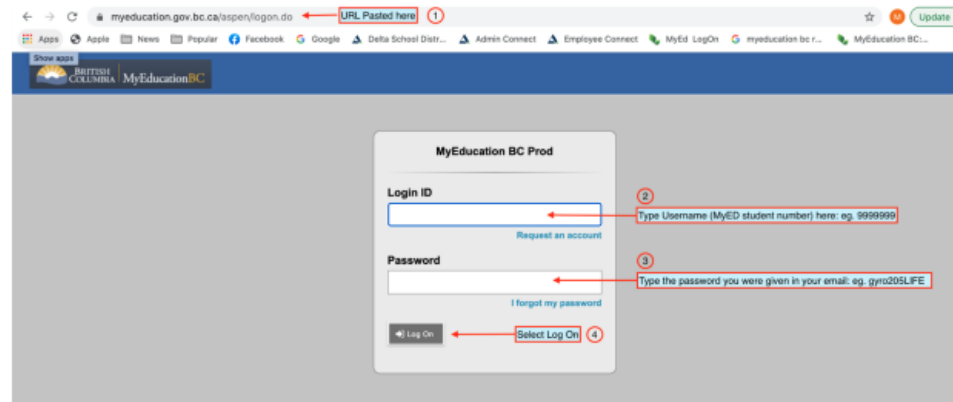
Logging Onto MyED BC

Step 1: Log in to <https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspn> using the user name and password supplied.

Step 2: Click on the URL or copy and paste it into an internet browser. It should take you to a screen that looks like this:



1. URL Copied and pasted into the browser.
2. Type or copy and paste the Username from your email into here.
3. Type or copy and paste the password from your email into here.
4. Select the Log On button.

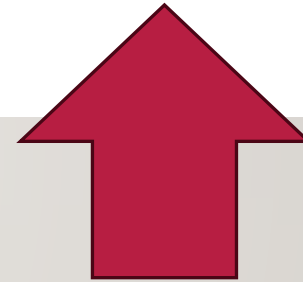

APPLICATION CONSIDERATION CANADIAN & AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES

- Many larger Canadian universities base admission on English 12 and 4 or 5 other approved academic grade 12 courses.
 - SFU & UBC – most grade 11/12 course ‘count’
 - SFU & UBC – require either Math 12 or Science 12 for general admissions
- American schools look at courses from grade 9-12 in all areas.
 - SATs and ACTs are now optional for many schools
