<u>Year books</u>

Yearbooks were given out today Friday, June 20 in Block A classes. If you students did not pick theirs up they are available at the front office starting on Monday, June 23. We are completely sold out and have none for sale. **If you have outstanding textbooks, they need to be returned before you can pick up your book.** Check the "Fees" tab in Parent connect to see if you owe any money and/or have paid for a Yearbook.

Locker Clean Out

Ideally students will be out of their lockers at the end of day on June 20. Exceptions will be made for those students who are attending Course Completion Days.

Course Completion Days

These are a few extra days after regular classes end for students to work with teachers to finish off and complete learning requirements from Term 3 only. Only those students who are close to passing will be invited. The dates are June 23, 24 and 25. Teachers will have office hours and students will sign up for times with them to come in and complete their learning. Teachers will have a "Flex" type sign-up for students on Student Connect.

Emergency Preparedness Fee

Last year, the school district introduced an annual **\$10 Emergency Preparedness Fee** to help ensure every school is equipped with essential emergency supplies - such as food, water, and first aid items - in the event of a major incident like an earthquake (<u>see letter from May 2024</u>). As of mid-June, the District has collected more than \$125,000, which is already being used to ensure each school is stocked with emergency food and water reserves.

This annual fee, due at the beginning of each school year, plays a vital role in helping us meet that goal and allows us to replace supplies as they expire.
